The theme of the colloquium is Knowledge creation for African realities to support local industrialization and sustainable development

- Provide a formal academic platform for the evaluation of doctoral research progress
- Critically assess the methodological rigor, originality, and scholarly contribution of each candidate's work
- Facilitate constructive feedback from faculty, peers, and examiners to enhance dissertation quality and coherence
- Ensure alignment with institutional standards and readiness for final submission and examination
- Promote intellectual exchange and foster a culture of research excellence within the doctoral community

Call for Abstracts

Presentations

The colloquium will feature two distinct formats of doctoral research presentation:

• Oral Presentations: Selected candidates will deliver structured, time-bound presentations before a panel of academic reviewers. These sessions will include formal feedback and scholarly discussion.

 Poster Presentations: Some candidates will present their research through visual posters displayed in designated exhibition areas. This format encourages interactive engagement, peer review, and informal dialogue.

Both formats will run concurrently across the two days, grouped by discipline and thematic relevance to ensure focused academic exchange.

Submission Guidelines

- Students should read the abstract format guidelines before submitting the abstracts. The guidelines can be accessed via the following Download link: Click Here To Download
- A 300-500-word abstract (without the author's name but including the student's SIN) must be submitted as a Microsoft Word file. This file should be uploaded via the following link: https://forms.gle/foKu25S2aGTKy3Yx8
- All submitted abstracts will be reviewed by Expert Reviewers to ensure academic rigor, professional contribution, and relevance to the colloquium sub-themes.
- Authors will receive feedback indicating whether their abstract has been accepted for oral or poster presentation

Upon acceptance, authors must submit a full colloquium paper written in 6–8 pages (MS Word format) by 30 October 2024, following the prescribed formatting guidelines

10 October 2025: Final date for submission of abstract

<u>17 October 2025 - Feedback on Abstracts ---</u> Authors will be informed whether their abstracts have been accepted for oral or poster presentation.
